

# Resurvey of a Portion of the California-Nevada State Boundary

chains

40.00 Point for  $5\frac{1}{2}$  mile cor. on California-Nevada State Boundary falls in inaccessible place on precipitous NE. slope.

49.46 Monument 89 on California-Nevada State Boundary, which is an unmarked pine post  $\frac{1}{4}$  ins. sq., 6 ins. above a mound of stone 3 ft. base and 2 ft. high.

This monument is on a sharp spur, slopes NE., which drops away in sheer walls of several hundred feet on the N., S. and E. sides. The monument is only to be reached by coming down to it from above, and along the top of the spur, which is very rocky; a precarious task.

Land; very rough mountainous.

Soil, rocky,  $\frac{1}{4}$ th rate.

Timber; dwarfed nut pine and juniper.

Undergrowth, none.

## Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 11 S., R. 41 E.

The boundaries of Ts. 10, 11 and 12 S., Rs. 41, 42 and 43 E., were surveyed in 1884-85 by G.S. Baker, D.S. There is no retracement or resurvey of any of these lines, of record.

The following notes describe a dependent resurvey of the E. bdy. of T. 11 S., R. 41 E., with sec. and  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cors. reestablished at proportional distances between the orig. cor. of Ts. 10 and 11 S., Rs. 41 and 42 E., and the proportionally reestablished cor. of Ts. 11 and 12 S., Rs. 41 and 42 E.

Beginning at the orig. cor. of Ts. 10 and 11 S., Rs. 41 and 42 E., hereinafter described:

South on a random line thru T. 11 S., bet. Rs. 41 and 42 E., setting temp. cors. at intervals of 40.00 chs. and making diligent but futile search for orig. cors.

480.00 Find no trace of the cor. of Ts. 11 and 12 S., Rs. 41 and 42 E. Set temp. cor.

Thence, west on a random line bet. Ts. 11 and 12 S., thru Rs. 41 and 40 E., setting temp. cors. at record distances and making diligent but futile search for orig. cors.

480.37 Find no trace of the cor. of Ts. 11 and 12 S., Rs. 40 and 41 E. Set temp. cor.

893.52 Fall 97.24 chs. N. of the cor. of Ts. 11 and 12 S., Rs. 39 and 40 E., which is a lava rock, 20x11x5 ins. above ground, in a mound of stone  $\frac{1}{4}$  ft. at base and 2 ft. high, and marked with 6 notches on N., S., E. and W. faces. This cor. was set in 1880, by L.D. Bond, D.S., who at that time surveyed the boundaries of Ts. 12 S., Rs. 38 and 39 E. In place of the stone cor., which is set alongside

Set an iron post 3 ft. long 3 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Ts. 11 and 12 S., Rs. 39 and 40 E., with brass cap marked
