

Resurvey of a Portion of the West Boundary
of T. 25 N., R. 7 E.

chains

From the cor. of Ts. 25 and 26 N., on W. bdy. of R. 7 E.
South, on random and true line on W. bdy. of sec. 6.

5.14 The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on E. bdy. sec. 13, T. 25 N., R. 6 E.,
which is a limestone, 8x8x12 ins. above ground, firmly set
in a mound of stone and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. side.

As this cor. now becomes an angle point on the W. bdy. of
sec. 6, I obliterate the marks $\frac{1}{4}$ and add marks AP.

Thence

S. 0° 42' W., on random and true line on W. bdy. of sec. 6.

27.74 A point which is 40.00 chs. in latitude from the closing
cor. of frac. secs. 7 and 18, T. 19 S., R. 51 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in the
ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$
sec. cor. of sec. 18, with brass cap mkd.

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34.91 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, only, which is an iron post, 1
in. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described
in the official record.

39.97 The angle point on the W. bdy. of sec. 6, formerly the old
cor. of secs. 13 and 24, T. 25 N., R. 6 E.; described in the
field notes of the Portion of fractional T. 25 N., R. 6 E.,
resurveyed under this group.

S. 1° 02' W., on random and true line on W. bdy. of sec. 6.

8.52 The closing cor. of T. 25 N., R. 6 and 7 E., on the Calif-
ornia-Nevada State Boundary, which is an iron post, 3 ins.
diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in
the official record.

From this point the 3 mile cor. bet. Monuments 104 and
105 on the state boundary bears N. 46° 29' W., 19.58 chs.
dist.; an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, marked and
witnessed as described in the official record.

At a point on the California-Nevada State Boundary which
is west of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on E. bdy. of sec. 18, T. 19 S.,
R. 51 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 6 ins. in the
ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$
sec. cor. of sec. 18, with brass cap mkd.

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From this point the 3 mile cor. bet. monuments 104 and
105 on the state boundary bears S. 46° 29' E., 10.40 chs.
dist.; an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, marked and
witnessed as described in the official record.
