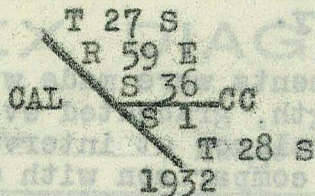


Resurvey of the South Boundary of Fractional Section 36
of
T. 27 S., R. 59 E.

chains

- 12.75 A wash, 80 lks. wide, course SW.; ascend 10 ft.
17.70 Short spur, slopes SW.; descend 110 ft.
23.00 Foot of hills, bears NW. and SE.; continue over rolling
desert, a general SW. slope.
32.73 Intersect the California-Nevada State Boundary.
Set an iron post 3 ft. long 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the
ground, for closing cor. of frac. Ts. 27 and 28 S.,
R. 59 E., with brass cap marked



and raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base and 2 ft. high east of cor.

From this point the $2\frac{1}{2}$ mile cor. bet. monuments 126 and 127 on the state boundary bears N. $45^{\circ}55'$ W., 4.09 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the California-Nevada State Boundary resurveyed under this group.

Land, rolling hills and rolling desert.
Soil, gravelly, 3d rate and rocky, 4th rate.
Undergrowth, scattering creosote brush, sage and cacti.

Resurvey of the E. Bdy. of Sec. 36, T. 27 S., R. 59 E.

From the cor. of Ts. 27 and 28 S., Rs. 59 and 60 E.

North on a random line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

- 39.14 A point 9 lks. E. of the orig. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
78.98 A point 12 lks. E. of the orig. cor. secs. 25, 30, 31 & 36.

Return to the cor. of Ts. 27 and 28 S., Rs. 59 and 60 E.

Thence, N. $0^{\circ}08'$ W., on true line bet. secs. 31 and 36. ($S\frac{1}{2}$)

Over mountainous land, thru scattering undergrowth.

Descend 40 ft. over a NW. slope.

- 4.00 A wash, 80 lks. wide, course SW.; ascend 215 ft.
18.00 A spur, slopes SW.; descend 100 ft. over a broken NW.
slope.
34.00 A sidehill ravine, course SW.; ascend 35 ft.

- 39.14 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.; a granite stone 14x11x11 ins. above ground, set in a mound of stone 3 ft. base and 1 ft. high and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. side. As this cor. now refers to section 31, only.

At point for cor.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long 1 in. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with the original stone corner set alongside, and in a mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. sec. 31, only, with brass cap marked
