Desert Entry 08412, by John B. Yount, Pat. No. 854486, issued March 11, 1922, embraces the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 24; NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, and N $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 25.

The location of this tract is controlled and determined from the orig. cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, on E. bdy. of Tp. No. 22 S., R. 54 E.

The son of the entryman was consulted and finds the survey acceptable. He informed me that the control I used was the same as that for the original entry, but the Tract survey fails to include his home and outbuildings within its boundaries. These buildings--also the well and windmill--are situated in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 24 of the independent resurvey. The owner of the Tract 39 should be permitted to acquire title to this land.
