

Resurvey of a Portion of the Von Schmidt  
California-Nevada State Boundary.

## chains

- 18.51 Von Schmidt triangulation pole, on rimrock edge of ridge; desc. 300 ft. on SE. slope.
- 35.50 Side ravine, 8 lks. wide, course E.; continue on NE. slope.
- 44.40 Stone fence, bears N. and S., at foot of slope; continue over open valley, thru old cultivated land.
- 51.60 Wire fence, bears N.65°E. and S.65°W.
- 54.10 Bryant Creek (called Mountaineer Creek by Von Schmidt) 12 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course N.40°W.; asc. 22 ft.
- 55.40 Graded road, bears N.25°W. to U.S. Highway No. 395 and S.25°E. to Monitor and State Highway No. 4; at foot of hills; asc. 130 ft. along W. slope, thru timber and brush.
- 55.60 Double 2 in. pipe line, bears parallel to road.
- 57.40 Old stone fence, bears parallel to road.
- 59.10 Forest Service telephone line, 1 wire, bears parallel to road.
- 80.12 The 232 mile cor.; a pine post, 6 ins. sq., 3 ft. exposed above a mound of stone, 5 ft. base and 2 ft. high, mkd. 0 232 miles on NW., 1873 on SE., NEV on NE. and CAL on SW. sides. At point for cor.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to drill hole in bedrock, and rebuild the mound of stone around post to top, for 232 mile cor., with brass cap mkd.

The original bearing tree:

A pinyon, 25 ins. diam., bears N.87½°E., 277 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks on old blaze.

The new bearing trees:

A pinyon, 6 ins. diam., bears S.82½°E., 48 lks. dist., mkd. VS 232M BT.

A pinyon, 12 ins. diam., bears S.24°W., 106 lks. dist., mkd. VS 232M BT.

Land, rolling mountainous and rolling valley.

Soil, clayloam, rock, 1st to 4th rate.

Timber, scattering pinyon, occasional yellow pine.

Undergrowth, sage and bitter brush, sandwillow, alder and dogwood.

S.49°03'E., on tangent and true line on 233d mile.

Asc. 225 ft. on W. slope, thru light timber and brush.

- 21.70 Side spur, slopes SW.; change to SW. slope.

- 29.00 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 185 ft. on SE. slope.

- 45.60 Foot of slope, bears E. and W.; continue across valley of creek, thru heavy willows and some timber; asc. 20 ft.

- 54.00 Bryant Creek (called Mountaineer Creek by Von Schmidt)
