Chains

Land, very rough and mountainous, - grazing.
Soil, rocky and sandy, 3rd rate.
No timber.

West Boundary of frac. T. 26 N., R. 23 E.

Survey commenced May 31, 1912, by Guy P. Harrington, U.S. Surveyor.

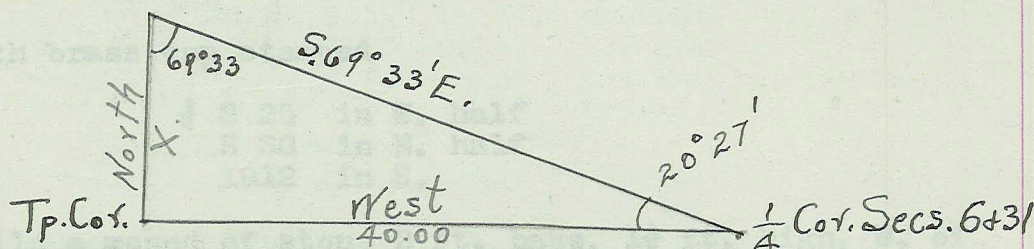
May 31, 1912. At 8h 00m A.M., l.m.t., I set off $40^{\circ} 04'$ on the lat. arc; $21^{\circ} 56\frac{1}{2}'$ N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Tps. 25 and 26 N., Rgs. 22 and 23 E., previously described.

Thence I run

North bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rough, mountainous land, ascending steep rocky slope.

As it is impossible to chain, I set a point on top of ridge to the North; from which point a flag at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 6 and 31, on S. bdy. of T. 26 N., R. 23 E., brs. S. $69^{\circ} 33'$ E.



$$X = 40.00 \text{ chs.} \times \text{Nat. Tang. } 20^{\circ} 27'$$

$$X = 40.00 \text{ chs.} \times .37289 = 14.92 \text{ chs. (dist. of triangulation)}$$

14.92 Top of almost perpendicular ledge, brs. E. and W.

Thence over rolling mountainous land, along summit of ridge.

30.20 Head of dry draw, course NE.

40.00 Set an iron post for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 31 and 36, with brass cap stamped
