with brass cap stamped

S 1 in S. half

Build a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N.
of cor.

57.81 Near summit of mountain, intersect the reservation bdy.

21.57 chs. N. 70° W. of the 123 Mile Post.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 26 ins. in the
ground, for C.C. of secs. 1 and 36, with brass cap
stamped

C C in E. edge
T 23 N R 22 E S 36 in NE. quadrant
T 22 N S 1 in SE. quadrant
P L I R in middle
6 notches on N. and 6 on S. edge

Build a mound of stone 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E. of cor.
