

Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation Boundary

Chains

Returning to the 116½ Mile Post, thence I run
S. 57° 00' E. on a true line along the reservation bdy.
Continue ascent of steep N. slope.

12.00 Mountain spur, brs. N. and S. Thence along NE. slope of spur.

40.00 The 117 Mile Post.

West of and alongside the stone, set an iron post, with
brass cap stamped P L I R W C 117 M P, in NE. half,
for witness cor. to the 117 Mile Post.

Land, mountainous, - grazing.
Soil, stony, 3rd rate.

July 8, 1911. At 8 a.m., l.m.t., I set off 39° 51' on
the lat. arc, 22° 34½' N. on the decl. arc, and deter-
mine a meridian with the solar, at the 117 Mile Post.

Thence I run

S. 57° 00' E. on a random line along the reservation bdy.

40.11 Intersect the 117½ Mile Post, which is a granite stone,
20x16x12 ins. above ground, mkd. 117½ M on NW., and
P L on S., - witnessed by a mound of stone to SE.

Returning to the 117 Mile Post, thence I run

S. 57° 00' E. on a true line along the reservation bdy.
Continue descent to NE. slope.

6.41 C.C. referring to surveys off the reservation, hereafter
described.

24.10 Small stream, 2 lks. wide, course NE. Heads at springs
150 lks. S.

37.10 Draw, drains N. Thence ascend NW. slope of ridge.

39.44 C.C. of secs. 19 and 20, referring to surveys off the
reservation, which is a granite stone 16x10x8 ins. above
ground, mkd. C.C. on S., P.L.I.R. on N., and witnessed by
a mound of stone to S.

40.11 The 117½ Mile Post. West of and alongside the stone, set
an iron post, with brass cap stamped P L I R W C
117½ M P, in NE. half, for witness cor. to the 117½
Mile Post.
