GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township consists of high mountainous land. The soil is stony 3rd rate.

The township is valuable for its grazing land. The higher portion of the township is covered with a scattered growth of juniper brush and bunch grass. The lower portion is covered with different varieties of sage brush.

Giger Bob, an Indian, has a small ranch in sections 11 and 14, about 5 acres of which is under cultivation. He obtains water for irrigation from a small mountain stream. There are no other improvements in the township.
