GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township consists of mountainous land, valuable for its grazing. There is a small amount of agricultural land in Hardscrabble Canyon. P. L. Flannigan, a white man, has in his possession land in sections 20 and 21 in this canyon, about 80 acres being under cultivation. His house and farm buildings are located in the NE. quarter of the NE. quarter of sec. 20. An Indian named Toby has about 5 acres under cultivation in the SW. 1/4 of the SE. 1/4 of sec. 16. An Indian named Louis has about 5 acres under cultivation in the SE. 1/4 of the SE. 1/4 of sec. 16. James Sutcliffe, a white man, has about 10 acres under cultivation at the mouth of the creek. He and his wife run a road house on the main road along the lake.

The agricultural land is in such a narrow strip that I did not make smaller subdivision of these sections. A Mete and Bound survey is the only way it can be described should it be deemed necessary to allot to Indians in the canyon.

This territory brings a good price for sheep range every spring.
