GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The land in this township is very rough and mountainous. The soil is rocky and the land is suitable for grazing purposes only. The mountain slopes are covered with bunch grass and scattered sage brush; while on the highest ridges are a few juniper trees.

Numerous springs of running water are in most all of the large drains.

Pyramid Lake forms the west boundary of the township, and in places the land slopes almost vertically down to the shore of the lake.

There are no roads or trails in the township.
