From the 1/16 sec. cor. No. 6, of sec. 2, bet. secs. 1
and 2, I run

West on a true line through the N. half of sec. 2.

Over gradual SE. slope.

14.23 Intersect the reservation bdy. 16.00 chs. S. 20° 42' E.
of the 131½ Mile Post.

Set an iron post for closing 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 2,
with brass cap stamped C C 1/16 S 2 P L I R, in E.
half. Build a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high,
E. of cor.

Land, gradual SE. slope- agricultural if irrigated.
Soil, sandy and gravelly, 2nd rate.

This fractional township consists of gently rolling
prairie. The whole area could be easily irrigated. The
soil ranges from a sandy loam, 1st rate to a gravelly-
stony, 2nd rate.
