Build a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.
Gorlinski's cor. brs. 50 lks. E., which I destroy.

44.29 Intersect the reservation bdy. 12.06 chs. N. $69^{\circ} 55'$ W.
of the $124\frac{1}{2}$ M.P.

Set an iron post for C.C. of secs. 5 and 6, with brass
cap stamped

C C in N. edge
T 22 N S 5 in NE. quadrant
R 23 E S 6 in NW. quadrant
P L I R in middle
and W C in addition
5 notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edge

Build a mound of stone 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of cor.
Gorlinski's C.C. brs. 25 lks. S. $69^{\circ} 55'$ E., which cor.
I destroy.

Land, broken, mountainous, - grazing.
Soil, stony, 3rd rate.
Scattered juniper timber full distance.

G E N E R A L D E S C R I P T I O N

This township consists of level, agricultural land,
and broken mountainous land, suitable for grazing only.
Portions of the mountainous land are barren of vegetation
and of no value. Considerable juniper is found growing
on the mountainous slopes. Some form of irrigation must
be established to make the so called agricultural land
arable and productive.

The entire area is covered with a scattered growth of
sage brush and clumps of bunch grass.
