GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The land in this township is very rough and mountainous. The soil is sandy and rocky, and the land is suitable for grazing purposes only. The sandy flats along the lake and the lower mountain slopes are covered with scattered sage brush and bunch grass, while on the higher ridges there is no vegetation.

Winnemucca Lake forms the East boundary of the township and a well travelled wagon road follows the shore of the lake.

A large spring known as "Seven-mile Spring" is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 10.
