GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The land in this township is very rough and mountainous. The main summit of the "Lake Range" runs in a northerly direction through the western part of the township.

The soil is rocky. The mountain slopes are covered with sage brush and bunch grass, suitable for grazing purposes only. On the highest ridges are a few juniper trees.

In the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 22 is an enclosed field of about 40 acres, known as the "Potato Patch". At one time this field was under cultivation.

Winnemucca Lake (a salt body of water) forms a portion of the eastern bdy. of the Tp.

A well-travelled wagon road follows the shore of Winnemucca Lake.

There are a number of springs in this Tp.
