

Subdivision of T. 20 N., R. 24 E.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township consists of level to rolling land, most of which is agricultural, and under cultivation.

The town of Wadsworth is situated in the NE. quarter of sec. 4, and the NW. quarter of sec. 3.

The Truckee River enters the township in sec. 8 and leaves in sec. 3.

Wm. Pearson, John Gravanta and Edward J. Posvar operate large ranches and are using considerable unpatented land.

The main line of the S. P. R. R. passes through secs. 9 and 10, the Truckee River Canal following closely along the south side of the railway track.

The town of Wadsworth was at one time a very thriving town of 2000 inhabitants, but at present has a population of about 100 people.

Lands within the boundaries of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation in this township, to which title has passed from the United States, are as follows:
