GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township consists of level to mountainous land. The Truckee River traverses the township, entering in section 34, and leaving in sec 5. Considerable land is under cultivation along the Truckee river bottom, held principally by persons who have no rights thereto.

The northern part of Wadsworth townsite is in sec. 33.

Lands within the boundaries of Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation in this township to which title has passed from the United States are as follows:
