

Resurvey of the Idaho-Nevada State Boundary Line
from the 100 to the 120 Mile Post.

Chains

- 196.16 Irrigation ditch, course N.
224.16 Irrigation ditch, course N. 45° W.
227.55 Barbed wire fence, brs. N. 15° E. and S. 15° W.
242.16 The 109 mile post.

Land, nearly level, agricultural, 242.16 chs.
Soil, gravelly loam, 2nd rate.
No timber.

June 27, 1911.

June 28, 1911. At 8.00 a.m., l.m.t., I set off 42° 00' N.
on the lat. arc, and 23° 20' N. on the decl. arc, and
determine a meridian with the solar, at the 112th mile
post on the Idaho-Nevada state boundary line.

Thence I run

West on a random line along the 113th mile.

- 80.79 Falls 5 lks. N. of the 113th mile post which is a mound
of earth as witnessed and described in original notes.

Thence I run

N. 89° 58' E. on a true line along the 112th mile.

Over rolling, sage-brush flat.

- 16.25 Falls 4 lks. S. of a mound containing a stake, - no
marks distinguishable.

- 40.55 Dry drain, course N.

- 80.79 The 112th mile post.

Land, gently rolling. - agricultural, 80.79 chs.
Soil, gravelly, 2nd rate.
No timber.

June 28, 1911. At this post, I set off 23° 19' N. on
the decl. arc, and at 12h 03m p.m., l.m.t., observe
the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 42° 00'.

From the 113 mile post, I run

West on a random line along the 114th mile.

- 80.81 Falls 9 lks. S. of the 114th mile post, on the Idaho-
Nevada state boundary line, which is a stone 24x12x4
ins., marked and witnessed as described by the original
notes.
