	North of and alongside the stone, set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for W.C., stamped in cap
	D V I R 120 M in E. I D A in NW. N E V in SW. W C 1911 in S.
	Thence I run
	N. 88° 54' E. on a true line along the 120th mile.
	Over rolling, sage brush plateau, ascending.
3.86	Dry drain, course NW.
20.86	Dry drain, course NW.
38.86	Top of ascent, brs. N. and S. Descend.
45.36	Dry drain, course NW. Foot of descent; ascend.
