

North Boundary of T. 46 N., R. 53 E.

Chains

East on a true line bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Through scattered clumps of brush, ascending.

8.40 Top of ridge, brs. N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.

Thence over rolling land.

9.00 Leave clumps of brush; enter thicket, brs. N. and S.

13.50 Leave thicket; enter prairie, brs. N. and S.

35.50 Small ridge, brs. NW. and SE.

39.47 Intersect the East bdy. of the Duck Valley Indian Reservation at a point from which the SE. cor. of the Reservation, on the 9th Standard Parallel N., brs. South 480.46 chs. dist.

Set an iron post for C.C. of Tps. 46 and 47 N., R. 53 E., stamped in cap

T 47 N S 35 in NW. quadrant  
T 46 N S 2 in SW. quadrant  
R 53 E C C D V I R in W.  
1911 in S.  
6 notches on N. and S. edges

Dig pits 30x24x12 ins., crosswise on each line, N. and S., 4 ft., and W. of post 8 ft. dist., and raise a

mound of earth 5 ft. base, 2 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, mountainous. (Crazing land, 39.47 chs.)  
Soil, gravelly and stony, 3rd rate.  
No timber.  
Brush, aspen and laurel.

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1911 in S.  
6 notches on N. and S. edges  
Build a mound of earth 5 ft. base, 2 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, level and mountainous. (Crazing land, 39.47 chs.)  
Soil, stony, 3rd rate; gravelly, 2nd rate.  
No timber.  
Brush, willow.

July 15, 1911. At this cor., I set off 22° 04' N. on the  
1901. 120, and at 12h 55d p.m., L.M.T., observe the sun  
on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 41° 56', which is  
within one minute of the proper lat.
