

East Boundary of T. 47 N., R. 52 E.

Chains

Soil, stony, 3rd rate.
Timber, stunted aspen.
Brush, laurel and aspen.

July 14, 1911. At this cor., I set off $21^{\circ} 47'$ N. on the decl. arc, and at 12h 06m p.m., l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is $42^{\circ} 00'$.

North bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over rolling plateau, through scattered clumps of brush.

13.70 Intersect the Idaho-Nevada state boundary line at a point from which the 104 mile post, previously described, brs. S. $89^{\circ} 33'$ E., 35.39 chs. dist.

Set an iron post for the C.C. of Tps. 47 N.; Rgs. 52 and 53 E., stamped in cap

R 53 E S 6 in SE.
R 52 E S 1 in SW.
T 47 N C C NEV 1911 in S.
6 notches on E., S. and W. edge

Build a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, rolling plateau. (Grazing land, 13.70 chs.)
Soil, stony, 3rd rate.
No timber.
Brush, scattered laurel.
