 - 80.00 The cor. of Tps. 46 and 47 N., Rgs. 51 and 52 E., previously described.
- Land, nearly level. (Agricultural, sage brush land, 80.00 chs.)
 Soil, gravelly, 2nd rate.
 No timber.

North Boundary of T. 46 N., R. 50 E.

Sept. 14, 1911. At 8 a.m., l.m.t., I set off 41° 56' on the lat. arc, 3° 43' N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Tps. 46 and 47 N., Rgs. 50 and 51 E., previously described.

Thence I run west on a true line bet. secs. 1 and 36. Over rolling land, through sage brush.

- 14.65 Begin descent, brs. NW. and SE.
- 37.00 Foot of descent; thence over rolling land.
- 40.00 Set an iron post for the ¼ sec. cor. bet. secs. 1 and 36, stamped in cap

 S 1 1911 in S. half

Build a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

- 56.00 Drain, course NW.
- 80.00 Set an iron post for the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, stamped in cap
