Build a mound of stone 2 ft. base,
1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

58.00 Foot of descent, brs. NW. and SE. Ascend.

79.74 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.

Land, rolling plateau - sage brush grazing, 79.74 chs.
Soil, 2nd and 3rd rate, stony.
No agricultural land. No timber.

From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, I run
N. 0° 04' W. on a random line bet. secs. 5 and 6.

40.00 Set temp. ¼ sec. cor.

80.00 Falls 7 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32 on
N. bdy. of township heretofore described.

Thence I run

S. 0° 07' E. on a true line bet. secs. 5 and 6.

Over rolling rocky sage brush prairie, ascend.

22.00 Top of ascent, brs. NW. and SE. Descend gradually.

40.00 Set an iron post for the ¼ sec. cor. bet. secs. 5 and 6
with brass cap stamped

¼ S 6 in W. half
S 5 in E. half
1911 in S. edge
