## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The topography of this township varies from that of a gently rolling prairie to a broken mesa or plateau. The two tiers of sections on the west side of the townsip are rocky, of third rate soil, covered with an abundance of grass excellent for grazing, and are separated from the remainder of the township by a distinct rim, varying from 50 to 150 ft. in height, and that portion west of the rim is a broken plateau or grazing mesa with little or no drainage. At present there is a portion of section 12 under cultivation. The remainder of the township is a gently rolling sage brush prairie, or flat, of good second rate soil, sometimes gravelly, and with irrigation would make excellent farming lands.

The drainage of the township is through numerous drains, towards the north and into the Owyhee River, however no running streams all year.

There are no settlers in this township.
