Chains

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.84 Falls 5 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22.
 Thence I run
 East on a true line bet. secs. 15 and 22.
 Over gently rolling plateau, descending.

12.00 Bottom of valley, brs. N. and S. Foot of descent.

18.00 Dry stream bed, banks skirted with willow brush 2 chs.
 wide, course S.

32.00 Leave valley, brs. N. and S. Ascend.

38.00 Summit of ridge, brs. N. and S. Enter aspen thicket, brs.
 N. and S. Top of ascent; begin descent.

39.92 Set an iron post for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 15 and
 22, stamped in cap
 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 in N. half
 S 22 1911 in S. half
 Build a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of
 cor.

60.00 Bottom of valley, 5 chs. wide, sides skirted with willows.
 Leave aspen underbrush; enter prairie, brs. N. and S.
 Foot of descent; begin slight ascent.

79.84 The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.
 Land, rolling plateau. (Grazing land, 48.00 chs.; brush
 land, 32.00 chs.)
 Soil, stony, 3rd rate.
 Brush, willow and aspen.
 No timber.
 Aug. 16, 1911. At this cor., I set off $13^{\circ} 55'$ N. on the
 decl. arc, and at 12h 04m p.m., l.m.t., observe the sun
 on the meridian; the resulting lat. is $41^{\circ} 58'$, which
 is within one minute of the proper lat.

East on a true line bet. secs. 14 and 23.
 Over rolling plateau.

39.43 Intersect the E. bdy. of the Duck Valley Indian Reserva-
 tion at a point from which the C.C. of secs. 23 and 26
 brs. South, 79.93 chs. dist.
 Set an iron post for the C.C. of secs. 14 and 23, stamped
 in cap
