

Subdivision of T. 47 N., R. 53 E.

Chains

Aug. 19, 1911. At the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, I set off 13° 58' N. on the decl. arc, and at 12h 04m p.m., l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 42° 00'.

Thence from the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, I run N. 0° 03' E. on a true line bet. secs. 2 and 3.

Along W. slope, covered with dense laurel and aspen undergrowth.

9.13 *end* Intersect the Idaho-Nevada state boundary line at a point from which the 100 mile post brs. N. 89° 39' E.. 39.44 chs. dist. (heretofore described).

Set an iron post for C.C. of secs. 2 and 3, stamped in cap

T 47 N S 3 in SW. quadrant
R 53 E S 2 in SE. quadrant
N E V C C 1911 in S.
2 notches on E. edge and 4 notches on W. edge

from which

An aspen 12 ins. dia. brs. S. 34° 30' W., 1.03 chs. dist.

Mkd. T 47 N R 53 E S 3 C C B T.

An aspen 6 ins. dia. brs. S. 46° 23' E., 1.16 chs. dist.

Mkd. T 47 N R 53 E S 2 C C B T.

Land, heavily rolling. (Brushy, 9.13 chs.)

Soil, stony, 3rd rate.

Brush, aspen, laurel and sage.

No timber.
