General Description

This Township is situated on the western slope of the Eastern range of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, & has a general descent towards Lake Bigler. The surface in sections 22, 27, 33 & 34 is comparatively level. In the balance of the township it is very much broken by high mountain spurs, ridges & deep ravines. The whole township is a formation of coarse grained Syenitic Granite, large boulders & masses of which cover nearly all the summits & slopes of the mountains, forming in many places high isolated knobs & bluffs.

The mountains along the East Boundary are from one to three thousand feet high, above Lake Bigler. One Peak in Section 36, rises to the height of 3456, feet above Lake Bigler, ascertained by triangulation. The soil is mostly a coarse
