

This Township is of a very rough and mountainous character being covered entirely by the Torigabe range. There are some small spots in the narrow Canions fit for cultivation and grazing, but not enough to warrant subdivision. Several streams flow into Reese River, and Smoky Vallies serving to irrigate the low lands. The timber is Nut pine with some Cedar, but lying in scattered blocks, and limited in quantity.

This Township is covered by the rough ridges of the Torigabe, except a few sections in the N. W. Corner where Big Creek issues from the mountains. Upon the bottom of this Creek are several farms under cultivation. Upon the mountains are scattered blocks of Nut Pine.

T. 18. N.

In this Township a large proportion is susceptible of cultivation. On Big Creek bottom are a number of grain farms, and vegetable gardens, and the Sage brush slope is mostly good soil, and much of it can be irrigated. A portion of the eastern tiers of sections is rough, mountainous, and denuded of timber.

T. 19. N.

A large proportion of this Township is fit for cultivation or grazing. Reese River flows through the western portion, and several farms are under cultivation. The Sage brush land is much of it good and can be irrigated. No timber.

R. 43. E.
T. 20. N.

Except a portion in the N. E. and S. W. corners covered by low hills, much of this Township, contains land fit for cultivation, and grazing. Reese River flows through the western portion, and along it are several cattle and Milk Ranches, and hay farms. Stalcin Creek flows through the northern part, and there are some settlements on that Canon. No timber.
