Creek range of mountains, where

General Description.

This line commencing as will be
seen by the notes passes over a low range
of hills covered with Cedar and Red Pine and
enters Diamond Valley. The portion of Deep
Creek Valley on the line is destitute of water
with the exception of Roberts Creek which flows
from the mountains on the North and South
near the line. The soil is poor, and there
is but little grass. Diamond Valley has an
abundance of fine bunch grass, but the only
stream which waters it, does not probably
cash late in the season. The Diamond
