

General Description,

Contained within these exterior boundaries, is both level, and mountain land. The former possesses fair soil, most of it capable of cultivation, and is covered with sage brush, bunch grass and greasewood. There is some fine meadow land, of rich soil, from which mow or less hay can be cut every year. The water resources, are Guinn's River, Jackson, Trout, Hellow and Bottle creeks, which afford a good supply, besides there are some large springs, which give rise to smaller streams. The mountain land is the Antelope Range, which divides the two valleys. There is but ~~but~~ little timber and that scrubby. They are high and rocky, with ~~poor~~ soil, and cannot be subdivided.
