

General Description,

Th~~ese~~ land embraced within these Exterior boundaries, is what is called Monitor Valley and it is one of the fertile valleys of the state. A good many settlers are located in the valley and are engaged in farming or the raising of live stock, the land being excellent for grazing purposes. White sage, bunch & ryegrass and sage brush, with some scattering pinon and juniper form the growth, the former being plentiful.

The town of Belmont is in the S.E. corner of T⁹ N. R¹⁰ E. and is an interesting little

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
