Va.  $16^{\circ}30'$  East.

Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam.

12 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{2}$  Sec. Cor., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. on W. face, dug pits, 18 x 18 x 12 ins., E. and W. of post  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. dist., and raised a mound of earth  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base around post.

Set a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square,

12 ins. in the ground, for Cor. to Secs. 30-31-35-36 marked T. 36 N. S. 30, on N. E., R. 59 E., S. 31 on S. E., S. 36 on S. W. and S. 35 on N. W. face, with / notch on S. and  $\int$  notch on N. edges; dug pits, 18 x 18 x 12 ins. in each Sec.,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. dist., and raised a mound of earth 2 ft. high,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base around post.
