80.82 To a point 105 lks. North of the Cor.
to Sp. 44 and 45 N., R. 35 and 36 E.,
which is a post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins.
square, 12 ins. in the ground, marked
T. 45 N., S. 31 and N. E.
R. 36 E., S. 6 and S. E.
T. 44 N., S. 1 and S. W. and
R. 35 E., S. 36 on N. W. face, with
6 notches on each edge, in a
small earth mound. As the post was
greatly decayed, I reestablished
Cor., by setting a Volcanic stone
 $18 \times 6 \times 5$ ins., 12 ins. in the ground
alongside of Post, marked with 6
notches on each edge and rising
a mound of stone covered with earth.
