Survey made with Burt's Patent Improved Solar
Compass new and in first-rate order. Made by

Instrument examined and compared with the true
Meridian at Reno April 16th 1882 and
found correct.

At noon on May 16th 1882
I set my instrument at the Cor. to Tps. 21 N Rgs. 21
& 22 E. on 4th Standard Parallel North
I took the latitude and found it to be 39°

37' N. I carefully examined all the adjust-
ments and found them correct. Kirk W Taylor.

From the cor to Tps 21 N Rgs 21 & 22
on 4th Standard Parallel North
which is a post firmly set in the ground
marked T 21 N R 22 E S 31 on N.E. and
R 21 E S 36 on NW and SE on S.
Face and from which bears

A cedar 8 ins. diam., S 63° 20' 110 lks. dist.
marked T. 20 N R. 21 E S., B. T.

A cedar 10 ins. diam., N 44 1/2° E 20 lks. dist.
marked T. 21 N R. 22 E S. 31 B. T.

A cedar 7 ins. diam., S 10 1/2° E 44 lks. dist.
marked T. 20 N R. 22 E S., B. T.

A cedar 8 ins. diam., N 30 1/2° W 44 lks. dist.
marked T. 21 N R. 21 E S. 36 B. T.

Run
North on a random line bet. R. 21 & 22 E.
Va. 1730 East.

I set temporary corners at every half mile, and at 6
miles on 34 chs. I arrive at a point 96 lks. W of Cor. to
T 21 & 22 N. R 21 & 22 E
