Which is a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, firmly set in the ground, marked T. 26 N. S. 7 on N. E., R. 61 E. S. 18 on S. E. R. 60 E. S. 13 on S. W. and S. 12 on N. W. faces, with 4 notches on S and 2 notches on N edges.

1 Cedar 16 ins. diam., S 46° W 17 lks. dist. marked T. 26 N. R. 60 E. S., 13 B. T.

on a true line between sections 7 & 18 with same va. Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam. with marked stone, 12 ins. in the ground, for 1/2 Sec. Cor., marked 1/2 S. on N face, dug pits, 18 x 18 x 12 ins., E and W of post 5 1/2 ft. dist., and raised a mound of earth 1 1/2 ft.
