Ascend.

- 14.00 Top of Spur, bears N.W. & S.E., and descend.  
 14.00 Set a Basalt stone  $1\frac{1}{2} \times 10 \times 6$  ins. 9  
 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. Cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on IV,  
 face and raised a mound of stone.  
 Pits impracticable.

- 67.25 Cross Gulch, 20 lks. wide, Course S.E., and ascend.  
 78.91 Intersect the 6<sup>th</sup> Standard Parallel South at a  
 point 13.80 chs. West of the Standard Cor. to  
~~24~~ S., R.S. 61 - 62 E., at which  
 point I. Set a Basalt stone  $16 \times 10 \times 6$  ins. 11 ins. in the  
 ground, for closing Cor. to Tps. 23 S., R's 61 and  
 62 E., marked C.C. with 6 notches on S.E. Wedges,  
 and raised a mound of stone. Pits impracticable,
