Walk on a true line between sections 1-6

Va. 10° East.

Ascend.

14.00 Top of Spur, bears N.W. & S.E. and descend.

140.00 Set a Basalt stone $14 \times 10 \times 6$ ins. 9 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ on N, face and raised a mound of stone.

Pits impracticable.

67.25 Cross Gulch, 20 lks. wide, Course S.E. and ascend.

78.91 Intersect the 6th Standard Parallel South at a point 13.80 chs. West of the Standard Cor. to ~~Sec~~ 24 S., R. 61 - 62 E., at which point I.

Set a Basalt stone $16 \times 10 \times 6$ ins. 11 ins. in the ground, for closing Cor. to Tps. 25 S., R's 61 and 62 E., marked C. C. with 6 notches on S.E. W. edges, and raised a mound of stone, Pits impracticable,
