29.00 Top of Spur, bears N. 68° W., 2nd S. 68° E., and descend.40.00 Set a basalt stone 10 x 10 x 6 ins., 7 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, and raised a mound of stone. alongside. Pits impracticable.

80.00 Set a basalt stone 19 x 17 x 3 ins. 14 ins. in the ground, for Cor. to Tps. 3 and 4 N., R's 49 and 50 E., marked with 6 notches on each edge, and raised a mound of stone. alongside. Pits impracticable.
