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General Description

This township is well watered by numerous springs at the heads of Cottonwood and Fish Creeks which are partially dry channels the waters rising and disappearing along their course.

All the land surveyed by me is mountainous the general slope being from the East and affords excellent grazing, the wild grasses being unusually abundant.

In subdividing the west tier of sections embraced in this contract I was unable to find any corners upon which to close, consequently the re-tracement of the old section line was necessary.

Having identified the corner of sections 29, 30, 31 & 32 and having already found the closing corner to sections 5 & 6 on the 7th Standard I find by calculation the course of the line to be $N. 1^{\circ} 20' E.$ and accordingly re-survey the same and find sufficient evidence of old corners to justify my conclusion.

All posts used are of redwood.
