

General Description

This Township consists almost entirely of level benches running in a southeasterly direction in the West half & in a Southwesterly direction in the South East Quarter. These benches rise higher towards the North & are separated by channels which carry off the snow water from the mountains to the West & North East.

The North east quarter of this Tp. is very mountainous & rough, well timbered with pine cedars & mahogany. The entire Tp. affords good pasture especially in the foothills where the grass is very plentiful.

Coil Creek is a living stream running thro' the entire Tp. Horse Creek is supplied by springs which dry up in the summer.

The soil in the surveyed portion is a sandy loam & very fertile in the valleys. There is no alkali.

The hay raised on the Coil ranch in Dec. 4 & 9 commands the highest price in the market. Good crops of alfalfa grain & potatoes are raised in the valley.
