

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township consists principally of high broken tableland, falling to the east into deep ravines & sharp ridges which are covered with wild grass, watered by numerous springs and afford excellent pasturage.

In the bottom of the ravines are various narrow alluvial deposits which are well adapted to agriculture.

There are several patches of mountain mahogany which have no commercial value except for firewood for which there is at present no demand in this part of the country.

I did not discover any trace of mineral in the township.
