

General Description

This township is mountainous except along Beaver Creek in the NW. It has a few numerous spots in the bottoms where grain might be raised & the soil is generally good as evidenced by the heavy growth of sagebrush.

It is well watered by Beaver, Cabin, Horse & Cottonwood creeks & springs and affords excellent pasturage.

The bedrock cropping near the surface in some cases precluded one from setting rocks to the depths demanded in the manual. In such cases they are set firmly in the ground but to a lesser depth.

There is no timber in the township but a few willows along the creek bottoms.
