instrument are satisfactory.
The magnetic bearing of the
true ^{meridian} at 8^h 30^m A.M. is N. 16° 45' W.
the angle thus determined gives
the mag. decl. 16° 45' E.

The cor. of Tps. 32 and 33 N.
Rs. 38 and 39 E. being a
stone badly decayed with
markings nearly obliterated
and with traces of old iron
and pits. I reestablish
old cor. by setting a granite
stone 24 x 12 x 8 ins. 18 in. in
the ground at exact point
of old cor. for the cor. of Tps.
32 and 33 N. Rs. 38 and 39 E.
Marked with 6 notches
on the N. S. E. and W. edges.
T. 33 N. on NE. T. 39 E. on SE.
