May 10, 1904, at Socock, Ariz. I set off $40^{\circ} 47'$
 ^{$17^{\circ} 38' N$ on deep arc}
 on lat. arc, and determine a meridian
 with solar at the Cor. of Tps. 33 and 34 N. Rs.
 38 and 39 E. heretofore described.

Thence I run

North on a random line in Tps. 34 N. bet.
 Qs. 38 and 39 E. setting temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec and sec.
 cor. at intervals of 40.00 Chs. and at
 480. 40 Chs. Intersect N. bdy. of Tps. 34 N. R. 38 E.
 19 lbs. W. of the cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N. Rs. 38 and
 39 E. heretofore described.
