S bdy. T 29 N. R 33 E.

With notes described fully on page of the re-survey of the Dyer Standard June 1st 1901 at con. to Secs 3, 4, 33 & 34 wh. is a post, mound, & pits on road side from Oreana to Limerick on the night of June 30th 1901 with instrument in complete adjustment at 12^{h.} 52^{m.} I observe

polaris at eastern elongation. Next morning again drive picket 5 chs Northwly on line & set off 1° 36' the azimuth to lowest.

July 1st 7 am I set off 40° 20' 11" on lat arc & 23° 10' 17" on decl arc & obtain a meridian by solar obs. which agrees with the stellar.

Mag. Decl. 7 am. 18° 05' E.
