

Resurvey S. Bdy T. 20 N. R. 24 E
 Chains June 20, 1903, 7th 10th A.M. l.m.t.
 I set off $39^{\circ}34'N$ on latitude arc,
 and $23^{\circ}27'$ on declination arc, and
 determine a true meridian by
 solar at cor. of Tp. 20 N. Rgs. 24 and 25
 E. which is a basalt stone $20 \times 12 \times 6$
 ins. as described by the Surveyor
 General.

Thence I run N. $89^{\circ}57'W$ on a
 random line on the S. bdy of
 sec. 36.

- 13.65 Closing cor. T. 19 N. Rgs. 24 and
 25 E. which is as described by the
 Surveyor General, bears N. 10 lks.
- 40.10 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. a basalt stone $8 \times 6 \times 4$ ins.
 lying on the ground bears N. 29
 lks.
- 80.35 Cor. of secs. 35 and 36, a basalt stone
 $10 \times 8 \times 6$ ins. in a mound of stone
 bears N. 76 lks.
- 120.72 Mound of stone presumably
 remains of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears N.
 121 lks.
- 161.25 Cor. of secs. 34 and 35 which is
 a basalt stone $8 \times 6 \times 4$ ins. firmly
 set in a mound of stone bears
 N. 168 lks
