

Resurvey of Fract. N. Bdy T. 20 N. R. 34 E.

Haines June 22, 1903 at 7 h. 41 m. A.M. Lmt.
 I set off $39^{\circ}37'$ on Lat. arc. and $23^{\circ}28'$
 on Dld. arc. and determine a true
 meridian at the cor. of sec. 13-18-19 and 24
 on W. boundary of Tp. which is a volcanic
 stone $14 \times 8 \times 6$ ins properly marked and set
 in a small mound of stone.
 I freshen marks and reset firmly
 in a mound of stone and raise
 a mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft
 high W. of cor.

Pits impracticable.
 Thence I run S. on a random
 line

39.70 The 4th sec. cor. which is a basalt
 stone $10 \times 4 \times 3$ ins in a mound of stone
 bears N. 11 lbs.

80.80 The cor. of sec. 19-24-25 and 31
 which is a basalt stone $8 \times 6 \times 6$ ins
 lying on the ground bears N. 22 lbs.
 I destroy the old cor. and reestablish
 in original location as follows:
 Set a volcanic stone $16 \times 12 \times 8$ ins
 in a mound of stone for cor. of sec.
 19-24-25 and 30 marked with 2 notches
 on S. and 4 notches on N. edges.

Raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base
