

General Description

This township is nearly all mountainous, there being but little level land along the larger streams. There is some meadow land in sec. 3, 4, 15, 16, 22, 29 and 30. The soil varies from 1st. rate to solid rock. Bunchgrass is abundant throughout as is a light growth of sagebrush.

There are willows and aspens along the streams and on the moist places and mountain mahogany on the higher ground. There are many prospect holes in various sections and the township has some mineral resources. There has been considerable mining in the N. E. portion of the Twp, both placer and quartz. The surface is scattered with well washed blue quartzite gravel. At the time of survey several mines were in operation on a small scale. The minerals sought are gold and silver. U. S.
