General Description

This tp. is all mountainous and the soil varies from medium quality to stony worthless. The greater part being about 3rd rate. All but the very rocky portions of this tp. is covered with of fair growth of bunch and rye grass. There is also sage brush but the growth is generally light.

Aspens and willows are about the only timbers and these are found only along the streams and in moist places.

There are evidences of prospecting having been done in the northeastern part but there seems to be little indications of mineral any place on the tp.

This tp. is of a volcanic formation.

It is situated on the great divide and is well watered by numerous spring and small streams. The entire tp. is well adapted to grazing for sheep, horses, and cattle.
