

Resurvey of the S. bdy of T. 39 N., R. 23 E.  
 Chains Sept. 21, 1906. At 8<sup>h</sup> 00<sup>m</sup> a. m. s. m. t.  
 I set off 41° 4' on the lat. arc:  
 0° 55.5' N. on the decl. arc. and  
 determine a true meridian with  
 the solar at the Cor. to sec's  
 35 and 36 on the S. bdy of T. 39 N.  
 R. 23 E. which I reestablish  
 at same point by setting same  
 stone, which is a basalt 18x16x8  
 ins 12 ins in the ground for  
 Cor. to sec's 35 and 36: mark  
 with one notch on E. and 5  
 notches on W. edge. raise  
 a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  
 1½ ft. high N. of Cor.  
 pits impracticable.  
 Thence I run N. 89° 58' W. on a  
 true line along S. bdy of T.  
 39 N., R. 23 E. setting Cor. at  
 40.00 Chs intervals and  
 destroying all other Corners.  
 N. 89° 58' W. on S. bdy sec. 35.  
 Over mountainous land  
 descending.  
 Closing Cor. to Tps 38 N., Rs 23 and  
 24 E.
